Complaint on 14-Aug-2023 :

When visiting the pool, the hotel pool operator noted that he had found snakes in the pool, pool room, and pump room. The snakes he located were removed from the facility. Inspector did locate a snake shed in the pool room. The staff

member hypothesized that patrons were leaving the exterior fire exit doors open and a pregnant snake was able to access the facility via those doors. The health dept. recommended installing a sign on the doors noting that these doors can not be kept open in order to be in compliance with Wis. Admin. Code ATCP 76 to remind patrons to keep the doors closed. The inspector hypothesized that a pregnant snake was able to access the pump room via an open baffle window that was shielded with a large course mesh grate that could allow a fairly large snake to enter. Further, the mesh present was also broken in areas. Inspector encouraged staff to install a fine mesh grate but is not requiring it at this time. Since snakes were in the pool, disinfectant and pH were checked. Both were within acceptable ranges.

Complaint verified by staff and inspector. No violations written.
